INTERVIEW: JOSEPH GATT

Interview: Joseph Gatt Talks About Cyber-Life On The Bridge In Star Trek Into Darkness May 11, 2013

One of the more interesting new characters on the bridge of the USS Enterprise is played by British actor Joseph Gatt. Known previously for more physical roles (including playing a Frost Giant in Thor), Gatt landed a spot on the bridge of the USS Enterprise.

In an exclusive interview with TrekMovie.com, Gatt talks about life on the bridge and about his "unique features." Read on for details below, but there are minor spoilers.

Interview: Joseph Gatt talks life on the bridge

TrekMovie: What can you tell us about how you got the role in the Star Trek movie?

Joeseph Gatt: It was pretty standard stuff, really. I got a call from my manager saying that I had an appointment to read for April (Webster) and Alyssa (Weisberg.) Even though I wasn't told the name of the movie, I pretty much knew it was for ST2 because of who was casting it and the secret nature of the audition. I had three separate meetings over a period of a couple of months and read several different sets of sides before finally being offered the role. I didn't even know what exactly I was going to be doing. All I knew was that the Bridge of the Enterprise was going to be my character's place of employment.

TrekMovie: First can you clear something up, I was told by Make-up designer David Anderson that your character's name was 'GATT-2000' – was that just a nickname or is that really the name of your character?

Joeseph Gatt: Well, this is the interesting thing. While shooting, all the cast were given generic, non-specific names for security reasons, and also because J.J. is very spontaneous and likes to figure out a lot of things on the fly. I don't think (and most of this is speculation) that a specific name had been decided upon by the time of that Bad Robot event you went to in December so David (who, with his team at AFX studios, designed my character) told you "GATT2000." This was the descriptive name he gave my character on set. This was later changed to "GATT5000," since "GATT2000" seemed a little anachronistic considering that the movie takes place in the 23rd Century. My manager just recently (earlier this week) received confirmation from the Paramount publicity department that I could publicly say that my character name is "GATT5000."

EDITOR'S NOTE: Interview conducted before London premiere, TrekMovie has confirmed that Joseph Gatt's final credit lists him as "Science Officer 0718"

TrekMovie: What can you tell us about your character? I saw what you looked like and see there is some kind of flashing blue thing in the back of you head implying you have some kind of cybernetic implant?

Joeseph Gatt: I'm not in a position to tell you much more then you already know, as I'm not sure what J.J. would like released or not (and it's safer to err on the side of caution.) But what I can tell you is that I'm an augmented human and one of my cybernetic augmentations is on the back of my head. The concept is that it's a miniature version of the ship's main computer which puts me in direct telepathic connection with the ship's systems at all times. I'm the Six Million Dollar Man in space!

TrekMovie: When you were first cast I had thought – thinking of very physical role in Thor and your background – that you would be one of the Klingons. Were you surprised you ended up on the bridge?

Joeseph Gatt: I was, actually, and pleasantly so. I always thought that when I booked something on a show like "STAR TREK" it would be a heavy action role, so to end up on the bridge was a total surprise, but a very pleasant one. I did get the opportunity to do some action, but I also wish that there was more physical stuff for "GATT5000." Maybe in the next one...?

TrekMovie: What was the shoot like? Were you on the bridge for most or all of the bridge scenes?

Joeseph Gatt: All of my stuff was on the bridge set at Sony Studios, and everything that happens on the bridge involves or contains my character in some way. We spent about six weeks shooting all the Enterprise bridge scenes before they moved on to another set.

TrekMovie: What is the atmosphere with the rest of the cast on the bridge? Serious? or more casual?

Joeseph Gatt: It's always a very interesting situation when you join an established cast. You never know if they're going to welcome you warmly or treat you as the fifth wheel. In this case I had nothing to worry about. Everyone in the cast and crew were awesome and welcomed the new cast with open arms. J.J. creates such a familial atmosphere on set and wants everyone to appreciate that it takes EVERY person on that set to make this thing happen. No matter what the size of your role or job, everyone is treated with equal importance. He spent just as much time talking to the background extras as he did with the principal cast. He is a great director with an amazing social awareness and led the project with an incredible energy, imagination, and friendliness! Considering the high stakes involved in making such a big budget movie, the atmosphere on set was generally very casual, but business-like. There were moments of intensity and seriousness, of course. The work was never sacrificed for play, but there was always play and fun. No matter what was going on, no matter how long the day, no one was ever allowed to forget that we were supposed to be having fun.

TrekMovie: So did you make it out alive? Think you have a future in Starfleet?

Joseph Gatt: I can't tell you that! But I'm not wearing a red shirt, and its up to you to guess if J.J. would break a 50 year old Trek tradition or not (winky face). I would, of course, love to continue to be involved in the Star Trek universe and to hopefully work with J.J. again on other space projects in the near future...

STARFLEET CHAPLAIN CORP

Hi everybody-

Doc Leeser here. This is the first time I have written for the Wyvern's Tale. I am not very good at this kind of writing, but since I have a new calling on the ship, I thought I'd write a note.

In addition to being your most awesome Doctor in the Fleet (just kidding) I am now your Ship's Chaplain. I accepted this as a calling and I take it very seriously.

As your Ship's Chaplain, it is my duty to investigate any discrimination or harassment that a crew member may be experiencing due to their faith. 20% Of Handbags Carry More Bacteria Than A Toilet

Astonishingly, a high percentage of women's handbags carry more bacteria than the average toilet, says British company Initial Washroom Hygiene.

The company reported that, on average, one in five handbags contains a significant amount of harmful bacteria that can pose a threat to human health.

Technical Manager at Initial Hygiene, Peter Barratt, said: "Handbags come into regular contact with our hands and a variety of surfaces, so the risk of transferring different germs onto them is very high, especially as bags are rarely cleaned.

Once these germs get on the bags, they can easily be transferred via hands onto other surfaces. Regular hand sanitization is essential to prevent the presence of bacteria in the first place and thorough cleaning of bags is recommended to prevent the build-up of contamination."

The researchers said that leather handbags in particular pose the most significant health hazard, because their spongy material is an ideal environment for most bacteria.

This finding means that the most cherished handbags of many women may actually be a breeding ground for harmful bacteria.

Bottles of hand cream appear to be the dirtiest and most infected items carried in the average handbag.

RPGs, Collaborative Fiction, and Fan fiction

Commodore Ros Haywood (USS Wessex Web Development Officer) and Fleet Captain Dave Jamison (USS Wessex Second Officer) have worked as a collaborative fiction team since their days on USS Matrix, writing and posting in such story arcs as:

- "Pirates of Orion" an attempt to infect Orion databases with a computer virus and delete their battle plans (during which the Orion Syndicate got a Real Life email address and joined the mailing list, abducting the hero of the RPG!). This RPG introduced Orion princess Verex
- •"Splat!" the CO is away and so the rest of the crew play paintball all over the ship
- •"The Refit" crewmembers begin to disappear, Ros is supplanted by a Borg drone and Dave is assimilated or is he?
- •"A Stitch in Time" time travel action where the USS Matrix meets the USS Matrix of 20 years ago; the 'old' Matrix is blown up by the House of Duras, Ros is killed, and Dave goes back in time to stop this happening.
- "A Small Business Matter" (unfinished RPG) with a humanitarian mission under threat by an infestation of tribbles

and then RPGs on USS Wessex, including:

- "Shakedown Cruise" (unfinished RPG) where systems are tested, crew gathered, and a practical joke played on XO Ros Haywood
- "The Encounter" Cardassian debris suggests Orion involvement, but then USS Wessex is attacked by the Borg while CO Dave Jamison sits in his ready room in a strange trance
- "Obedience Brings Victory" CO Dave Jamison talks about opening diplomatic relations with the Dominion, while a Changeling spy impersonates XO Ros Haywood in order to sabotage the talks
- "The Final Stage Begins" continuation of "Obedience Brings Victory" Changeling Ros escapes and tries to sabotage USS Atlantis, while Dave Jamison takes USS Wessex into battle with the Jem'Hadar before they can attack the Federation.

Now Ros and Dave are working on another collaborative project, with working title "A Time to Heal" involving the Jem'Hadar, Section 31 and secret missions for USS Wessex.

Dave Jamison is an experienced writer, having joined in other USS Matrix RPGs. He also makes cameo appearances in fiction written by Ros Haywood – as USS Wessex CO, an Admiral of the Fleet and most recently as a philosophy teacher in a girls' school.

Ros Haywood has written 68 courses for Starfleet Academy and five full-length novels (so far), three of which are to be published later this year. The latest three are part of a series for children and youth, while the first two are Star Trek fan fiction (and as such are not to be published for copyright reasons):

- "Synchronicity" continues where USS Wessex's "The Encounter" left off, and introduces an old (USS Matrix) adversary, Verex of Orion, teaming her up with the Borg Queen and the head of the Orion Syndicate as they threaten the galaxy with telepathic assimilation
- •"Guardian Angel" eternal 'bad girl' Verex, now the new Borg Queen, travels to the past to destroy the Guardian of Forever, throwing Kirk, Spock, and McCoy into lives they never would have led otherwise. Rosie Blake (a.k.a. Ros Haywood) goes back in time to repair the Guardian with the missing Stone of Blood and restore the timeline, aided (?) by Q

On 15 February 2012, Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus announced the 65th ship of the *Arleigh Burke* class of destroyers to be *Rafael Peralta*.

In honor of Marine Rafael Peralta, who was petitioned for the Medal of Honor for shielding several Marines from a grenade in November 2004 during Operation Iraqi Freedom; however, he was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross instead after doubts regarding the exact sequence of events prior to his death was raised.

The ship's roles will include anti-aircraft, antisubmarine, and anti-surface warfare, as well as strike operations.
